

IMPORTANT INFORMATION REGARDING SHOW SITE/HOTEL

- There is a four (4) dog limit per room.
- All owners/exhibitors should be aware that the entire hotel grounds are considered within the Show grounds. You will be responsible for all damage to your room and may be subject to disciplinary action in accordance with the rules of the AKC.
- The hotel will provide detailed maps at time of check in that detail waste pick up locations and where x pens are to be located on hotel grounds. It is expected that exhibitors will clean up immediately after their own dogs and strongly encourage others to do the same.
- Dogs may not be kept in rooms which are registered as "dogless." Any abuse of the grounds will be brought to the attention of the show giving club and its Event Committee.
- Any exhibitor's entries may be refused for previous misuse of the hotel facilities. This is an AKC supported measure.
- There will be a one-time nonrefundable pet fee in the amount of \$55 per room. Cash paying guests will be charged a \$250 per room damage fee that will be refundable upon departure and inspection of room.
- The hotel reserves the right to request that dogs be removed from the room when cleaned. Use strainer when bathing pets in guest room.
- Dogs must be crated when left alone in the room. Dogs shall not be allowed to run free in your room while you are gone, nor may you confine them in the bathroom. NO EXCEPTIONS!
- Place plastic sheeting under all crates, X-Pens and other equipment for confining your dog(s).
- Do not use hotel towels for dog grooming. There is a \$50 towel fee for using hotel towels.
- Dogs must be kept quiet in the hotel rooms and in the grooming area.
- Dogs must be exercised in designated areas only as noted above.
- There will be no whelping of puppies in the hotel.
- Some areas of the hotel are off-limits to dogs. These include: All areas that serve food and beverages; Recreation areas including the Pool and Health and Fitness Room; and Public Restrooms.
- Grooming will be in designated areas and will be available on a first-come, first-served basis. Crates must be stacked whenever possible.
- Absolutely NO exercise pens in the grooming area.
- The Clubs reserve the right to limit the space any one exhibitor or group claims for grooming.
- There will be no security service on duty overnight. NO DOGS MAY BE LEFT IN THE GROOMING AREA OVERNIGHT. All dogs and equipment must be removed one hour after judging is completed on 10/26/2018.
- DOGS ALLOWED IN RINGS ONLY WHEN BEING JUDGED. There shall be NO SMOKING within
 the grooming or ring areas, in vendor areas, or restrooms at any time. The hotel will provide
 an area for a maximum of ten RV's that must be registered with the hotel. The American
 Lhasa Apso Club, the Clarion Inn Frederick Event Center, and/or the Event Secretaries, their
 officers, members or agents assume no responsibility for dogs or personal property left in
 the hotel facilities or parking lots.

All prizes must be claimed in the judging ring before the completion of the judging of the breed, and the Show Chairperson advised at once in the event of any discrepancy. No award will be mailed. The Clubs reserve the right to substitute a prize of equal or greater value.

AKC NATIONAL OWNER-HANDLED SERIES – ALL THREE SPECIALTIES

The purpose of the AKC National Owner-Handled Series (NOHS) is to recognize and showcase the quality dogs being exhibited by owner/handlers and to provide a venue for the owner/ handlers to compete against their peers. The determination of the awards in the AKC National Owner-Handled Series is based solely on the quality of the entry. The owner/handler's handling ability is not of consideration.

*Professional handler is defined as any person who belongs or has belonged to a professional handlers' organization, distributed rate cards, or otherwise advertised or represented themselves as handling dogs for pay within the last five years. Eligibility restrictions apply to all members of the same household. Household members and current assistants to professional handlers in conformation are not eligible to exhibit in this competition. A current assistant is defined as anyone employed by a professional handler on a full-time basis or assisting a professional handler at the show or any show during the cluster/weekend. Eligibility restrictions apply to all members of the same household.

Spayed and neutered animals may be entered and shown in Veteran Classes at specialty shows. Winners of the Veterans Classes may also compete for Best of Breed Competition, provided that they are undefeated in any Regular Class at this show.

Non-Regular Classes (Involving multiple dog entries)

Note: Non-regular classes involving multiple entries may be judged before or after Best of Breed. As the judge's decision in these classes will be based on the merits of more than one dog, no one of the dogs making up the entry judged first in the class will be eligible to compete for Best of Breed or Best of Opposite Sex to Best of Breed by virtue of having won the class.

Stud Dog Class and Brood Bitch Class: Each entry is allowed a minimum of two and no more than six of their Get. The merits of the Stud Dog or Brood Bitch are not considered in the placement of the entry. It is the quality of the get that forms the basis for the judge's decision. All get must be examined and gaited. The Stud Dog or Brood Bitch must also be examined to determine if there is a condition that would require disqualification or excusal under the Rules, AKC policy or the breed standard. All get must be entered in a regular class in order to be eligible to compete in the Stud Dog or Brood Bitch, and all get being exhibited, must wear armbands. Ch. 11, Sec. 8 of the "Rules Applying to Dog Shows" provides that "a castrated male may be entered as a Stud Dog in the Stud Dog Class and a spayed bitch may be entered as a Brood Bitch in the Brood Bitch Class."

Brace Class: Two Dogs, performing in unison, and presented by a maximum of two handlers. Both dogs competing in the brace class must have at least one common owner. Dogs do not need to be entered in any other class. Dogs comprising a Brace Class must be named at the time of entry, and full particulars must be given for each dog on individual entry forms. If a dog which is to be part of a Brace is not entered in another class, it must be entered for "Brace Class only." An entry form for a dog entered in another class and entered as part of a Brace must be marked accordingly in the space provided for additional classes as "Brace Class."

Entry Fees for Rally include \$3.50 AKC Recording Fee for the first entry and \$3.00 additional entry of the same dog. Note: Rally Trials are separate events from Obedience Trials. DO NOT consider Rally as an additional class with an entry in conformation or obedience.

If the same dog is entered in more than one class, the highest priced class shall be considered the first entry. Canadian Exhibitors must make fees payable in U. S. Funds.

- **NOVICE CLASS:** For boys and girls who are at least 9 years old and under 18 years old on the day of the show and who at the time entries close have not won three (3) first place awards, with competition present, in a Novice Class. A first place in Novice without competition leading to a Best Junior award with competition would count as one win towards moving to Open at a licensed or member show.
- **OPEN CLASS:** For boys and girls who are at least 9 years old and under 18 years old on the day of the show, and who have won three first place awards in a Novice Class or if a win in Novice leads to a Best Junior with competition present it will count as one win towards moving to Open in a licensed or member show. ALAC FUTURITY/MATURITY RULES

FUTURITY/MATURITY ELIGIBILITY

Futurity Eligibility: The nomination of a litter is open to anyone who breeds a litter of Lhasa Apsos. A litter nomination must be made within 90 days of birth. By nomination of the litter, all dogs in that litter are eligible to enter the Futurity, regardless of ownership change. Litters born between April 1, 2017 and ending March 31, 2018, (or August 15, 2018, with payment of penalty for late nomination) and nominated are eligible to show in the Futurity. Nomination fee is \$20.00 per futurity litter. Entries after 90 days of birth will be accepted with a late fee until August 31st of the year of the futurity. Late fee schedule will be as follows: 1-30 days late - initial \$20 nominating fee + additional \$15, 31-60 days late - initial \$20 nominating fee + additional \$25, 61-90 days late - initial \$20 nominating fee + additional \$40. Absolute deadline is **Aug 31st** before the National of that year. Maximum number of days late = 180 days (6 months of age).

Futurity Entries: All dogs entered in the Futurity/Maturity MUST also be entered in one or more of the regular classes at the ALAC National Specialty. The entry for the Futurity/Maturity class MUST be made on the same entry form. The entry form must be marked in the Additional Class section with the word "FUTURITY OR MATURITY" and the ASSIGNED FUTURITY/MATURITY NUMBER. The entry fee of \$25 for the Futurity/Maturity class must accompany the fee for the regular class. Entries without a Futurity/ Maturity litter number are not acceptable for competition.

This year's MATURITY eligible Lhasas: All Lhasas from litters nominated for the 2017 Futurity are eligible for the 2018 Maturity, dogs MUST BE nominated by their owners and *include the Futurity litter number from 2017*. All puppies from a futurity-nominated litter are eligible for the Maturity the following year and will receive their own Maturity number *provided the owner nominates the dog*.

- Females in season are not permitted to compete in Obedience or Rally Trials. If a female is withdrawn from
 competition because it came into season and the Superintendent is notified no later than one half hour prior
 to the start of the first class in the trial, the Clubs is required to refund the entry fee. The Clubs may retain a
 processing fee and must publish this information in the premium. Clubs may determine the documentation, if any
 that is required to confirm the female is in season. This shall be stated in the premium. Note: No fee is paid to the
 AKC for females in season who are withdrawn.
- FAX ENTRIES Fax entries will be accepted up to closing time. Fee is \$4.00 per dog per show. - Dogs need be present only for scheduled judging and will be released if not needed for further judging. Dogs
 must be ready for judging. Neither the club nor its Superintendent will be responsible or obligated to furnish any
 service for notifying exhibitors or their agents of Breed or Class Judging. Judges need not wait for any dog holding
 up a class. Owners or agents alone are responsible for the presence of their dogs in the judging rings.
- Only dogs eligible for these shows will be admitted into the show area. There is no provision for unentered dogs.
- LOSS OR DAMAGE The Show Committee will use due care and diligence for the welfare of dogs and exhibitors, but will not be responsible for, or assume any liability in the event of any accident or misfortune, to either dogs or exhibitors participating in these Shows. AKC Code of Sportsmanship

PREFACE: The sport of purebred dog competitive events dates prior to 1884, the year of AKC's birth. Shared values of those involved in the sport include principles of sportsmanship. They are practiced in all sectors of our sport: conformation, performance and companion. Many believe that these principles of sportsmanship are the prime reason why our sport has thrived for over one hundred years. With the belief that it is useful to periodically articulate the fundamentals of our sport, this code is presented.

- Sportsmen respect the history, traditions and integrity of the sport of purebred dogs.
- Sportsmen commit themselves to values of fair play, honesty, courtesy, and vigorous competition, as well as winning and losing with grace.
- Sportsmen refuse to compromise their commitment and obligation to the sport of purebred dogs by injecting personal advantage or consideration into their decisions or behavior.
- The sportsman judge judges only on the merits of the dogs and considers no other factors.
- The sportsman judge or exhibitor accepts constructive criticism.
- The sportsman exhibitor declines to enter or exhibit under a judge where it might reasonably appear that the judge's placements could be based on something other than the merits of the dogs.
- The sportsman exhibitor refuses to compromise the impartiality of a judge.
- The sportsman respects the AKC bylaws, rules, regulations and policies governing the sport of purebred dogs.
- Sportsmen find that vigorous competition and civility are not inconsistent and are able to appreciate the merit of their competition and the effort of competitors.
- Sportsmen welcome, encourage and support newcomers to the sport.
- Sportsmen will deal fairly with all those who trade with them.
- Sportsmen are willing to share honest and open appraisals of both the strengths and weaknesses of their breeding stock.
- Sportsmen spurn any opportunity to take personal advantage of positions offered or bestowed upon them.
- Sportsmen always consider as paramount the welfare of their dog.
- Sportsmen refuse to embarrass the sport, the American Kennel Club, or themselves while taking part in the sport.
