The American Kennel Club Rules and Regulations will govern this Show and Exhibitors must make themselves familiar with the agreement of the American Kennel Club, referred to on the reverse side of the entry blanks that accompany this Show Premium List.

- The American Kennel Club will collect: a \$3.00 Event Service Fee and \$.50 Recording Fee where applicable for the first entry of a dog, plus a \$3.00 service fee for each additional entry of the same dog in the regular and non-regular recordable single-entry classes, in all AKC licensed and member club events. At every licensed or member club rally trial, a recording fee of \$3.50 is required for the first entry of each dog and a recording fee of \$3.00 is required for each additional entry of the same dog. The event-giving club shall assume the responsibility of collecting all Event Service Fees for The American Kennel Club. These event service and recording fees shall be forwarded to The American Kennel Club along with all other required event results within seven (7) days of the close of the event.
- No Entry will be accepted which specifies any condition as to its acceptance. Telegraph, e-mail and unsigned entries cannot be accepted and will be returned. Entries not on Official AKC Entry Forms and Photocopies of Entry Forms without Agreement and Rules on reverse side are NOT ACCEPTABLE. The Club and/or Baray Events assumes no responsibility for wrong or incomplete information given on the entry blank by the owner or the owner's agent. **RESPONSIBILITY FOR COMPLETENESS OF ENTRY RESTS SOLELY WITH ENTRANT.**
- **RETURNED CHECKS DO NOT CONSTITUTE A VALID ENTRY FEE.** Baray Events will add a \$25.00 collection fee to the amount of each returned check. We will not re-process checks. The exhibitor will be contacted & required to send a money order for the original amount PLUS the \$25.00 NSF fee. Subsequent returned checks from same person may result in their being put on a CASH ONLY BASIS.
- **REFUNDS** for cancellations due to judge change or cancellations made prior to entries closing will be mailed by the Club to said Exhibitor or Agent **AFTER THE SHOW.** An administrative fee of \$5.00 will be withheld from all refunds for entries cancelled prior to the closing of entries. There is no refund for bitches in season in Obedience.
- **FAX ENTRIES** – Fax entries will be accepted up to closing time. Fee is \$4.00 per dog per show. If the credit card charge is denied for any reason, an additional service charge of \$20.00 will be added. **FAX NUMBER: (360) 683-6654.** This is for Fax Machine ONLY. Incomplete or illegible Fax entries are not acceptable as a valid entry in a show. Proof of transmission is not proof of receipt of a legible or complete transmission (under AKC Rule Ch. 11, Sec. 4). - Entries will be acknowledged after entries close with entry acknowledgment and judging program to address on entry. Should Exhibitor NOT receive an acknowledgment within a reasonable time, PLEASE notify Baray Events at (360) 683-1507 or email dogshows@barayevents.com.
- Entry fees shall NOT be refunded in the event that a dog is absent, disqualified, sick, lame, excused by the Judge or Veterinarian, or barred from competition by action of the Show Committee, or because it has been entered incorrectly. There is no refund for **DUPLICATE ENTRIES or OVERPAYMENTS.** Baray Events will make every effort to find all duplicate entries, but if entry has been processed, no refund will be made. If, because of riots, civil disturbances or other acts beyond the control of the management it is impossible to open, or to complete the Show NO REFUND will be made. - Please note: Any hotel or motel listed in the premium list is subject to Event Committee Rules. We expect our exhibitors to be responsible guests. Neither the club nor its Superintendent/Show Secretary will be responsible or obligated to furnish any service for notifying exhibitors or their agents of Breed or Class Judging. Judges need not wait for any dog holding up a class. Owners or agents alone are responsible for the presence of their dogs in the judging rings.
- Only dogs eligible for these shows will be admitted into the show area. There is no provision for unentered dogs.
- **LOSS OR DAMAGE** – The Club/Show Committee will use due care and diligence for the welfare of dogs and exhibitors, but will not be responsible for, or assume any liability in the event of any accident or misfortune, to either dogs or exhibitors participating in these Shows. Non-Regular Classes Involving Single Dog Entries

Because WINNERS of these classes will compete for Best of Breed (Variety), all entrants MUST also meet the American Kennel Club requirements for Non-Regular Classes involving single dog entries. The following classes are divided by sex.

VETERANS CLASS – A class for Dogs and a class for Bitches, 7 years of age and older.

FIELD CLASS – Class for Dogs and Class for Bitches that have earned working dog (WD) or working dog excellent (WDX) titles from their Parent breed clubs or received a placement at an AKC Field Trial.

Classes to be judged after Winners but before Best of Variety of Breed. Winners to compete for Best of Variety if undefeated.

NON-REGULAR CLASSES (INVOLVING MULTIPLE DOG ENTRIES)

Note: As the judge's decision in these classes will be based on the merits of more than one dog, no one of the dogs making up the entry judged first in the class will be eligible to compete for Best of Breed by virtue of having won the class. Ch. 11, Sec. 8 of the "Rules Applying to Dog Shows" provides that "a castrated male may be entered as a Stud Dog in the Stud Dog Class and a spayed bitch may be entered as a Brood Bitch in the Brood Bitch Class."

Stud Dog Class: For Stud Dogs and at least two but no more than four of their Get. Stud Dog must be entered in the Stud Dog Class and must be shown in the ring with their get. The owner of the stud dog need not necessarily be owner of the get. While the merits of the stud dog are not to be considered in the placement of the entry, the stud dog must be examined to determine if it has a condition that would require its disqualification or excusal under the Dog Show Rules, AKC policy, or the standard of the breed. Get must be entered in a regular class, Best of Breed Competition, or some other Non-Regular class.

Brood Bitch Class: For Brood Bitches and at least two and no more than four of their Produce. Brood Bitch must be entered in the Brood Bitch Class and must be shown in the ring with their Produce. The owner of the brood bitch need not necessarily be owner of the produce. While the merits of the brood bitch are not to be considered in the placement of the entry, the brood bitch must be examined to determine if it has a condition that would require its disqualification or excusal under the Dog Show Rules, AKC policy, or the standard of the breed. Produce must be entered in a regular class, Best of Breed Competition, or some other Non-Regular class.

Brace Class: Two dogs, performing in unison, and presented by a maximum of two handlers. Both dogs competing in the brace class must have at least one common owner. Dogs do not need to be entered in any other class. Dogs comprising a Brace Class must be named at the time of entry, and full particulars must be given for each dog on individual entry forms. Entry fee for Brace Class as a UNIT is \$35.00. If a dog which is to be part of a Brace is not entered in another class, it must be entered for "Brace Class only." An entry form for a dog entered in another class and entered as part of a Brace must be marked accordingly in the space provided for additional classes as "Brace Class." If more than one Brace is entered by same owner, dogs comprising EACH BRACE must be designated "Brace No. 1," "Brace No. 2," etc.

Beginning with the July 2013 National Specialty, ASC will offer a major for Reserve Winners Dog and Reserve Winners Bitch as provided for in Chapter 16, Section 1, of AKC's Rules Applying to Dog Shows. Said major awards will be offered at the National Specialty every year thereafter.

Rally Pairs, Novice – One handler working two dogs at one time through a rally course.

Rally Team, Novice – A rally team has 4 cockers spaniels, a 5th one may be listed on the entry as an alternate.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR ENTERING RALLY TEAM: Each dog is entered on a separate entry form and pays a \$15.00 fee (per dog). A team may have a 5th dog entered as an "alternate" at no charge (in the box for rally class write "team alt"). In addition, one entrant must send the Superintendent a comprehensive list of team members with each dog's registration number and owner's name. If you have a Team Name, include that as well, for printing in the catalog. The list of team members and name of team can be emailed. Use subject line: AMERICAN SPANIEL RALLY TEAM.

AMERICAN SPANIEL CLUB, INC. JULY ANNUAL COCKER SPANIEL NATIONAL SPECIALTY RULES FOR COCKER SPANIEL FUTURITY STAKE

The Futurity Stake is a showcase for the breeder's effort.

BREEDERS OF ENTRIES for the Futurity **MUST BE** American Spaniel Club, Inc. ("ASC") members in good standing through all steps of the Futurity (have annual dues paid, no suspensions). Any suspension of a breeder or co-breeder by AKC and/or ASC shall automatically disqualify the breeder from participation in the Futurity, to include any nominations for bitches owned, co-owned or leased during the suspension and any puppies bred or co-bred during the suspension. This includes disqualifying any existing bitch nominations or puppy enrollments and also disallows any future bitch nominations or puppy enrollments during the suspension period. No puppy will be eligible for futurity enrollment from any litter which was bred or co-bred by a suspended member, regardless of ownership. Owners (if other than the breeder) of entries are not required to be ASC members.

Nominations and Enrollments shall be sent to the Futurity Chairman only on the forms issued by the ASC. You may photocopy the forms. The forms state the required payment and information. Incomplete forms will be returned. Fees must be paid in U.S. Funds, (Checks drawn on U.S. Banks and U.S. Money Orders only). There will be no refunds. Checks on Foreign Banks for U.S. funds are not acceptable and if sent will be returned along with the Futurity Form.

The steps which must be taken to Futurity nominate are as follows:

1. Bitch Nomination.
 - a. The dam of the litter must be owned or leased by an ASC member(s).
 - b. The dam must be properly nominated prior to whelping (between July 1 and Dec. 31 inclusive).
 - c. Only puppies from nominated bitches, whelped after date of nomination, are eligible.
 - d. The nomination envelope must bear a post office cancellation stamp with a date prior to the whelping date. Postage Meter is not valid. If the postmark is not legible or is missing, the date mailed will be considered to be 2 days prior to receipt.
 - e. A fee of \$10 for each bitch nominated must accompany the form, in accordance with the instructions stated on the form. If the bitch's due date is such that she may whelp in either the January or July Futurity, you should nominate her for both.
 - f. Both sire and dam must be at least 2 years old before the breeding takes place.
 - g. Health testing must be done after the sire and dam reach age 2 and before the breeding takes place.
 - h. Eye exams must be done on or after age 2 and annually thereafter. Exams must be done not more than 12 months prior to the breeding unless the sire/dam is more than eight years old, in which case a clear exam after the age of eight will be accepted.
 - i. Documents which must accompany the nomination form:
 - * Photocopies of the individual registration certificates for both sire and dam.
 - * Photocopies of certification of clear eyes from a Board Certified Ophthalmologist or similar designation in the case of foreign entries for both sire and dam.
 - * Photocopies of OFA or Penn Hip certification for normal hips for both sire and dam or similar certification in the case of foreign entries for both sire and dam.

If sire and/or dam are listed in the ASC Health Registry, it is not necessary to forward copies of the registration certificate, eye or hip certification for that animal. If certification for either eyes or hips is not listed in the Health Registry, a copy of that certification must be sent. If the bitch is leased, send photocopies of the AKC Registration and Lease Form filed with the AKC.

2. Puppy Enrollment.
 - a. Enrollment of any puppies must be made on or before May 1.
 - b. Enrollments must be made on the form issued by ASC and a payment of \$10 per puppy is required.
 - c. The form will state the complete requirements, but generally, the name of the puppy, the name of the sire and dam, date of birth, sex, variety and individual AKC Registration Number must be given. Canadian-bred or Mexican-bred puppies may provide a Canadian or Mexican Registration Number, if an AKC number is not yet obtained.

d. Late Enrollment: You may make a late puppy enrollment for a TOTAL fee of \$25 per puppy, provided all other requirements are met. LATE ENROLLMENTS DO NOT GO BY POSTMARK. THEY MUST BE RECEIVED BY THE CHAIRMAN BY JUNE 1 FOR JULY.

3. Entry:

- a. Entries shall be made in the name of the OWNER(S), who need not be a member of ASC.
- b. A final payment of \$15 for each puppy to be shown shall be made to the Superintendent of the Show before the closing of entries for the Show, at which time the Name, AKC Number, Date of birth, Breeding, Sex and Variety of each puppy must be given on the Regular AKC approved Entry Blank, together with the payment of the Regular Entry Fee.
- c. Each puppy shall be entered in one of the Regular Classes and, in addition, the entry blank must also be designated "Futurity Stake."
- d. The BREEDER(S) of the puppy MUST STILL BE A CURRENT MEMBER OF ASC. The ASC is not responsible for any errors made on the Entry Blank and no refunds will be made by ASC.

The judging in each sex and Variety shall be as follows: 6 to 9 months; 9 months and over but not exceeding the age limitations of the Futurity. Each sex, each age group in each Variety shall be judged separately. Following the judging of each age and sex group of each Variety for best in each group above, the six shall be judged, first for best of each respective Variety, and Best Opposite Sex to each Variety, and from the final three shall be selected the Best Puppy in the Futurity. Any dog of opposite sex to Best in Futurity, if undefeated within their Variety, shall compete for Best Opposite Sex to Best in Futurity.

The money received by ASC from the nomination of bitches shall be divided as follows: 40% for the expenses of the Futurity Stake, 10% for the Best Puppy in Futurity (50% of this will be awarded to the puppy's owner; 50% to the breeder), 5% for Best Opposite Sex to Best In Futurity Puppy (50% of this will be awarded to the puppy's owner, 50% to the breeder), 10% for Best Puppy in each Variety, 5% for Best Opposite Sex to Best in each Variety.

The money received by ASC from the puppy enrollments and the final payment in each sex, each age group, AND each Variety shall be divided as follows: 40% of the total for expenses for the Futurity Stake, and the remaining shall be divided among each sex, each age group, and among each Variety as follows: 25% to First, 20% to Second, 10% to Third, and 5% to Fourth.

ATTENTION EXHIBITORS

The following rules and regulations will be strictly enforced by the show committee, or the Grand Sierra Resort, or both, as appropriate:

1. The show site will be available to exhibitors on Wednesday, July 10, 2013. The time will be published in the judging schedule.
2. The show site will be open July 11-14 from 6:00 AM until 11:00 PM. Dogs may be left overnight in the show building. All setups where dogs are remaining overnight must display a contact name and a phone number where they can be reached 24/7. Security guards will be on duty. No one will be allowed in the building between the hours of 11:00 PM and 6:00 AM, unless special permission is granted by the show chairman.
3. All dogs and equipment must be removed from the Silver State Pavilion by 9am on Monday, July 15, 2013. **NO EXCEPTIONS!**
4. There will be **NO SMOKING** within the confines of the building.
5. Sanitary conditions must be maintained in the show building and/or anywhere at the Grand Sierra Resort – **INCLUDING HOTEL ROOMS** - at all times. All exercise pens must be identified with the exhibitor's name. Exercise pens **MUST** be kept clean and will be patrolled by show committee members. Plastic and shavings will be provided courtesy of the Mission Valley Cocker Spaniel Club. Plastic **MUST** be under **ALL PENS**, regardless of whether trays are utilized. The show committee will monitor the cleanliness of the show building and reserves the right to request grooming areas to be cleaned at any time as deemed necessary. Dogs may not be off-leash anywhere at the Grand Sierra Resort.
6. Grooming of dogs will be confined to the tack room area. Bathing of dogs will be confined to the bathing area provided just outside the tack room. **ABSOLUTELY NO BATHING OR GROOMING OF DOGS IN THE HOTEL ROOMS!** Violation of this will be grounds for a bench show committee.
7. American Spaniel Club welcomes all exhibitors. We want you to know that we are taking a proactive step to protect the health and well-being of the dogs being exhibited at our show. ASC may require proof of vaccination (or titers) for any dog that is in attendance at the American Spaniel Club Cocker Spaniel National Specialty or it's Flushing Show. This documentation must be from a licensed veterinarian or a copy of vaccination record which shows the original labels from the vials of vaccine with the date of the vaccination. Vaccinations must be within veterinarian recommended protocol.
8. Please refresh your knowledge of AKC Rules and Regulations Chapter 11, Section 9. "No dog shall be eligible to compete at any show, no dog shall be brought into the grounds or premises of any show, and any dog which may have been brought into the grounds or premises of a dog show shall immediately be removed if it:
 - a) shows clinical symptoms of distemper, infectious hepatitis, leptospirosis or other communicable disease, or
 - b) is known to have been in contact with distemper, infectious hepatitis, leptospirosis or other communicable disease within thirty days prior to the opening of the show, or
 - c) has been kenneled within thirty days prior to the opening of the show on premises on which there existed distemper, infectious hepatitis, leptospirosis or other communicable disease.
9. Anyone who knowingly brings sick dogs onto the show premises will be subject to Bench Committee Hearing.

There are 4 outlets on each 2000w drop - the **TOTAL** amount of electricity available on any one drop is 2000w. It is **NOT** 2000w/per outlet, so please adjust your heat settings to insure power does not blow. Anyone that blows the power circuit more than once will have their electrical privileges revoked and will be responsible for any fines charged by the GSR.

I further understand that the assignment of reserved tack room space is a privilege that can be revoked from anyone who does not follow the rules, regulations and instructions of the American Spaniel Club or their agents.
